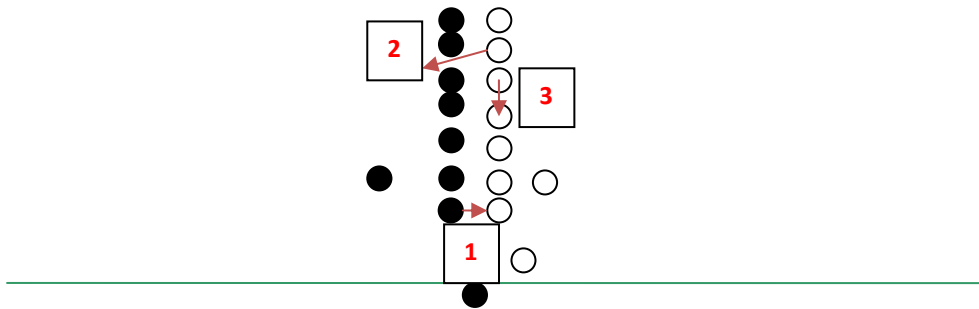
### 6.1 Referee Priorities

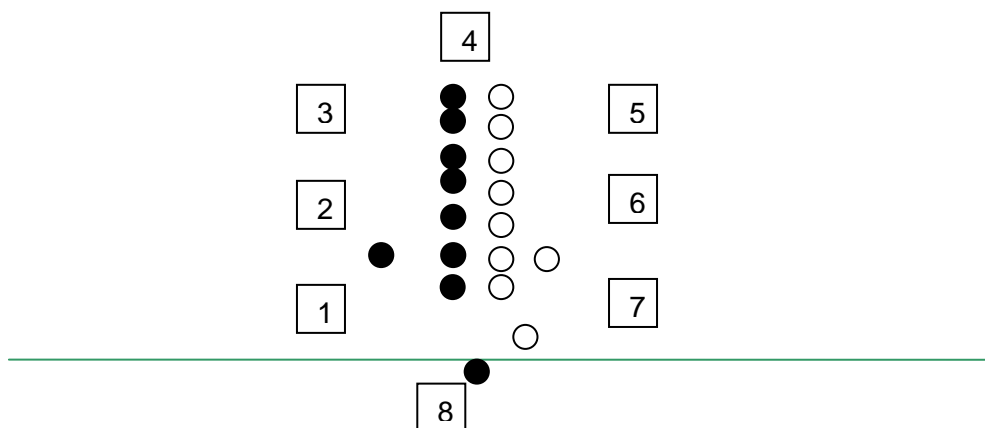

## 6.3 Lineout Management


Comment on the following lineout management techniques.

6.3.1 Referee to number 10 pre-match *"I will have my hand up as soon as the lineout is formed and all the way through the lineout. As soon as it is finished I will bring it down and you can bring them up"*

6.3.2 Referee to hooker pre-match when asked on his interpretation of not straight at the lineout *"By the law book"*

6.3.3 Referee to hooker pre-match when asked on his interpretation of not straight at the lineout *"In the space between the inside shoulders"*


6.3.4 Referee to hooker pre-match when asked on his view of the hooker enquiring, on a windy day, if it is alright that he throws the ball in slightly curved so that it lands in the space between the inside shoulders *“Yes, fine”*




6.3.5 Referee to hooker pre-match when asked on his view of the hooker enquiring, on a windy day, if it is alright that he throws the ball in slightly curved so that it lands in the space between the inside shoulders *“Look we are not TV, so let’s just have a game of rugby. OK? I will do the same for both sides”*




6.3.6 Referee to pack leader pre-match when told that his side will not compete on any of the opponents’ lineouts inside their own 22 but will “sack” the catcher with one of their forwards as soon as his feet have touched the ground. *“Yes, fine - as long as it is one man and it is immediate”*



6.3.7 Referee to players at first lineout *“Keep your hands on your own players not on the opposition”*



6.3.8 Captain to referee pre-match *“We use something called Space ball where we don’t challenge at some of their lineouts; we step out and let them win it. So when they come down there is no maul so we can go round and take the ball or you could even penalise them for truck & trailer”*



6.3.9 Referee to green pack leader at first lineout *“How many are you putting in to the lineout?”*



6.3.10 Referee to Black 4 who has complained that Green is doing an early lift. *“Yes I know, but they are doing it at the front pod and your hooker is throwing the ball over that and you are winning it at the second pod”*
